

Guidelines for Foreign Students to Entry into Thailand for Studying in Semester 1/2020

Reference to Royal Thai Government Gazette, dated on 30 June 2020, certain groups of foreigners will be allowed to enter the Kingdom of Thailand, including foreign students currently enrolled in Thai academic institutes. However, they must comply with the procedures determined by the Thai government as follows:

1. Documents required upon entering Thailand

- 1) Fit-to-Fly Health Certificate indicating no detection of the COVID-19 within 72 hours before departure.
- 2) Health insurance plans to cover all medical costs (including the COVID-19) throughout the duration of stay in Thailand with a minimum medical coverage of USD 100,000.
- 3) Certificate of Entry (COE) issued by a Thai Embassy /Consulate

1.2 Register for a flight to Thailand at a Thai Embassy /Consulate

1.3 Contact one of the facilities for Alternative State Quarantine (ASQ) that have been approved by the Thai authorities and obtain a confirmation for a 14-day quarantine. For more details, please visit <http://www.hsscovid.com/>, select an icon “Alternative State Quarantine (ASQ).” The estimated cost is about 28,500 – 144,000 Thai Baht, subject to facility.

2. After arrival, stay in the ASQ for the 14-day mandatory quarantine and comply with all measures made by the Department of Disease Control.

To facilitate the process, Thammasat University is issuing a letter for status confirmation to a Thai embassy/consulate to expedite the Certificate of Entry and flight arrangements as mentioned above.
